We would like to submit the enclosed 18 pictures to the Holocaust Museum. We believe, they should be placed in its archives as documents for future generations and especially for those who are denying that the Holocaust ever happened.

Both of us are survivors. We came to the United States from Czechoslovakia in 1967. The city of Waltham-Massachusetts became our new home. Mr. Abe KENNEN, who is the president of our Temple, gave us these pictures. He was among the American soldiers who liberated some of the concentration camps in Germany.

We would like to make a few comments on some of the pictures:

Picture # 14 shows items made of human skin.

5 & 8. 3 persons are recording their findings.

Beside the gallows, one can see a pile of human bones.

17. The two prisoners showing their tattooed numbers apparently look healthy, and well nourished. Our assumption is they probable worked at the camp kitchen.

We would like to thank you for everything you are doing to keep alive the memories of the 6 million innocent victims of the Holocaust.
